TNG AND CWA CONVENTION UPDATE

It was a pleasure to represent our local last month at the 2023 TNG and CWA conventions in St. Louis with our executive officer Candace Lund and executive committee member Larry Nelson.

We spent a busy few days connecting with our union siblings from across the country, many of whom I had only met over Zoom. Among the highlights were the elections of CWA's first Black president and secretary-treasurer, Claude Cummings and Ameenah Salaam, respectively.

Although our executive committee endorsed News Guild alum Sara Steffens for president, I am thrilled to have Claude leading our union and I know he'll be a passionate advocate for our members.

CWA members also unanimously approved another \$300,000 in funding to support our striking members in Pittsburgh, following several impassioned speeches from TNG folks.

MEETING MOTHER JONES

While attending the TNG–CWA convention, we took a side trip to the Mother Jones Museum and Memorial - located about 45 miles outside of St. Louis. The small museum and its passionate volunteers were in Mt. Olive City Hall, only a few blocks from the Mother Jones Memorial in Union Miners Cemetery. Mother Jones was a famous organizer and a cofounder of the IWW. She helped striking coal mine workers and was considered "the most dangerous woman in America." The cemetery was dedicated to those killed in 1898, fighting strike breakers of the Virden Mining Company in the Battle of Virden.

At her request, Mother Jones was buried with the coal miners that she helped organize. The monument, made with Minnesota granite, had a pile of union pins which visitors left at its base. The biggest highlight was when the Mother Jones impersonator gave a very impassioned speech. She drove a half hour on a Sunday afternoon to make sure we would have the chance to "meet Mother Jones."

If you are ever near Mt Olive, IL, I highly recommend a stop at the Mother Jones Museum and Memorial.



GUILD-MADE RECIPES

JALEPEÑO CORN MUFFINS

1 cup cornmeal Note: If you don't have cornmeal, polenta or semolina can be used.
1 (8.5-ounce) can whole kernel core
1 teaspoon baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
1 tablespoon jalapeño pepper, seeded and chopped finely
3 eggs, slightly beaten
1 cup shredded sharp
cheddar cheese, divided
1/2 cup milk
1/3 cup oil
12 nicklad jalanaña ringe (antional)

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 375 °F. Grease a 12-cup muffin pan.
- 2. In a large bowl, combine cornmeal, corn kernels, baking powder, salt, and jalapeño pepper with a spatula.
- 3. Add eggs, 3/4 cup cheddar cheese, milk and oil.
- 4. Combine all the ingredients together well.
- Divide corn mixture among the muffin cups. Top each muffin with the remaining 1/4 cup cheese. Place a pickled jalapeño on top of each muffin, if using.
- 6. Bake for about 20 to 25 minutes, until a tester inserted into the center of the muffins comes out clean.
