RUSTIN: a “moving biopic” about MLK mentor

“Rustin” is a moving biopic about Bayard Rustin, Martin Luther King Jr.’s mentor, who led efforts for the March on Washington. Colman Domingo eloquently captures the pain and pride that drove an activist, persecuted for both his sexual orientation and the color of his skin. He should be a strong Oscar contender. But the film, now streaming on Netflix, also has a lot to say about the power of unions. The film’s biggest hero, aside from the title character, is labor union leader A. Philip Randolph, played by Glynn Turman. Director George C. Wolfe makes it clear that skeptics like St. Paul’s own Roy Wilkins (Chris Rock) wouldn’t have signed off on the march if unions hadn’t lent their full support. The movie may be named after one man, but it’s determined to show that the historic event was a team effort.

Vital and Overlooked: Medical Interpreters

The recent report on my colleagues in the emergency room (“[The trauma of dealing with trauma never stops](#)”) was intimate and thorough, but I couldn’t help but notice the invisibility of a certain role — one that by design is meant to pass unnoticed but is critical in this high-acuity, high-stakes stage: the professional medical interpreter.

Our lack of inclusion is, in fact, most appropriate given that our role is to facilitate understanding and direct communication between providers and patients. Still, it’s disappointing that our essential service was not just glossed over but completely overlooked. When 1 out of 5 patients walking through Hennepin Healthcare’s doors require language services, we are integral to providing equitable health care.

As interpreters, we must remain true to the message and interpret as precisely as we can, which might mean cursing out a dear friend. Or perhaps we are the first ones to hear of the devastating cancer diagnosis before relaying the shocking news to the patient. No matter the verdict, we have the honor and burden of giving it.

We’re a crucial part of the caregiving team and work hand in hand with the heroes of HCMC’s emergency room.

Because just like them, it’s not just our job, it’s our vocation.

Union Members need a Home! Assistance for First-Time Buyers

It should be the expectation of every union member to have a home; it's part of our social contract, right behind health insurance, a pension, and the 40-hour week!

Most Union members have a stable income and often pay a significant rent but would prefer homeownership if we could get help with credit or a down payment. SEIU Local 26 has connected members to the Minnesota Homeownership Center, with some receiving as much as \$10,000 in downpayment assistance!

The Minnesota Homeownership Center can help you to get out of renting and achieve homeownership for yourself. They offer help with credit counseling, getting "mortgage-ready," the home buying process and the responsibilities that come with being your own landlord. They also are experts at

navigating the various down payment assistance programs that are out there.

Bill Gray, Stakeholder Relations Director at the Homeownership Center, reports that \$150 million in new downpayment [assistance for first-generation buyers](#) was passed by the State Legislature this past spring. The money will be available beginning in April of 2024. These funds are specifically aimed at people who have never owned a home, and whose parents or legal guardians also never owned a home.
