Greater Minnesota Forum and Mixer Brings Together Journalists

for Important Conversations By Neal Justin (Star Tribune)

The Minnesota Newspaper and Communications Guild is one of several sponsors for a series of exciting, educational events in Duluth on Wednesday, April 10.

Activities kick off at 2 p.m. with a student workshop at the University of Minnesota Duluth aimed at high-school and college students with a keen interest in journalism. Special guests include Laura McCallum, politics and government editor for the Star

Tribune; Neal Justin, TV critic for the Star Tribune; Laura Lee, Northern News Now anchor; and Katie Rohman, managing editor for the Duluth News Tribune.

That will be followed by a journalism mixer from 5-7 p.m. at Zeitgeist Restaurant & Bar. All working journalists are welcome to attend. We are particularly keen in seeing lots of fellow Guild members from the Duluth News Tribune. Appetizers will be served.

At 7 p.m. there will be a public forum, "Covering Politics in Greater Minnesota." Forum Topics will include:

- What is the role of journalists in a divisive political climate?
- How can they do a better job of covering races and issues in areas outside of major metropolitan areas?
- How can we all work together to combat misleading news?

Panelists include Iron Range author Aaron Brown, The Timberjay publisher Marshall Helmberger, Duluth News Tribune reporter Tom Olsen, WDIO anchor Renee Passal and Laura McCallum, politics and government editor at the Star Tribune.

These activities are designed to cater to readers and journalists who live outside the Twin Cities area, towns where getting responsible, accurate news is more challenging than ever. Both evening events are free, but you need to sign up ahead of time. Seating for the forum is limited.
